	Look for legginess, uneven growth, foliage discoloration, dead leaves or branches, and signs of insect infestation or disease.
	If roots grow in a tight circle or emerge from the soil, the plant may need a larger pot.
	Choose a new pot 1-2" larger than the current pot, remove old soil, add fresh organic potting mix, and replant.
	Trim uneven growth and remove dead leaves and discolored foliage periodically.
	Other:
Potted plants need care at any time of the year, but late summer is the perfect time to repot them and give them a new lease on life.
