TO-DO To remove turf, divide soil approximately 4" deep with a flat-bottomed spade. Square should be 10x10". Use a pitchfork to loosen turf, lift to remove squares and get all the roots. If planting immediately: add several inches of compost or other organic material and work into the soil. Add plants and water thoroughly. If planting in spring or weed infested soil: cover with a thick layer of mulch. Wait to plant until later the following spring. Follow instructions for step 2. Other: __ Use native plants instead of turf to provide water, food, shelter, and habitat for native birds, insects, and other wildlife. Native plants also need less water and are less disease-prone. **NOTES**
