APIARY STUDIO

Space Number: 2

Apiary Studio is exploring themes of duality and contrast in a night garden for their 2023 exhibit. They will be using plants that are activated at night through color and scent. Apiary Studio is excited about this year's theme so they can showcase the under-appreciated qualities that plants and gardens can have after sunset.

SUSAN COHAN GARDENS

Space Number: 3

In her exhibit, Susan Cohan aims to capture the joy one feels during the first burst of spring. Susan will be displaying spring ephemerals, and the hardscaping composition of her exhibit is based on the Fibonacci Sequence.

TREELINE DESIGNZ

Space Number: 4

Iftikhar Ahmed of Treeline Designz was inspired by the imagination of a six-year-old boy who was hiding in a bunker during the ongoing war in Ukraine. The exhibit will be the realization of a peaceful, magical landscape that people search for in nature.

ILLEXOTICS

Space Number: 12

ILLExotics have created a Studio 54-style disco that has been completely taken over by tropical foliage and flowers to showcase how the electric connection humans have with nature is similar to humans' connection to music. Their exhibit highlights aroids, orchids, bromeliads, and other tropical plants.

FROM BLOSSOMS

Space Number: 13

For her 2023 exhibit, Kat Claar of From Blossoms took inspiration from how many pollinator insects experience flowers and plants through an ultraviolet color lens. She will be presenting this in an abstract colorful scene that is her take on what pollinator insects see.

POLYCARP FLOWERS

Space Number: 15

Polycarp Flowers has created an immersive garden in a book exhibit to showcase the "sparks" of joy, creativity, and excitement that can be found in gardens and books, flowers, and stories.

IENNIFER DESIGNS

Space Number: 16

Jennifer Designs' exhibit displays how root systems in nature act in a very similar way to the human brain, highlighting how both nature and the brain use their own types of electricity. This exhibit is also partnering with the Franklin Institute to educate about the brain!

NATURE'S GALLERY

Nature's Gallery's exhibit is inspired by Iranian women displaying strength and courage in the uprisings and protests that followed the death of Mahsa Amini. The strong colors and complex textures of the flowers in their exhibit embody the character of the Iranian women, and the richness of the Iranian culture and society.

DELAWARE VALLEY UNIVERSITY

Delaware Valley University's 2023 exhibit is inspired by how plants capture, use, and store solar energy, like the living version of a battery.

The exhibit highlights the color "Electric Blue" to represent the energy of solar power in their garden.
